MARK DODDS

The Lucky Lake, Saskatchewan product, Mark Dodds, was a standout player with the University of Saskatchewan Huskies. In 2001-02 he was named the Canada West all-rookie team and in 2005-06 was named both the Canada West MVP and the CIS player of the Year as he helped lead the Huskies to first place in the regular season. In his playing time with the Huskies, Dodds led the team in kills and service aces. He sits fourth all-time on the Huskies career kills list with 939. Mark won the college national championship in 2004 with Red Deer. He represented Canada at the Canadian Universiade in both 2005 and 2007, where they finished with a silver medal in 2007.

Following his university career, Dodds went on to play for Canada's Senior Men's National Team from 2005-09.

Mark played Professional Volleyball in Berlin, Germany for Berlin Recycling Volleys from 2007-2009, and 2010-2011, and in Roeselare, Belgium for Knack Randstad Roeselare from 2009-2010.

He moved into the coaching ranks in 2011 as an assistant coach for the Huskie Men's volleyball team and in 2015 became the 6th Head Coach in the history of the Women's Volleyball team at the University of Saskatchewan.
