## **TIFFANY DODDS-LITTLE**

Tiffany hails from Lucky Lake, Saskatchewan, and made history in 2008 as the first Canadian female player, and only the second Canadian player at the time, to play professionally in Korea. She's also played professionally in Spain, Puerto Rico, Japan and Indonesia. After her season in Japan she signed with Russian Champions League team Dinamo Moscow, but could not fulfil the position due to injury.

With versatility at three positions, Tiffany was recognized as one of the brightest young stars of North American Volleyball. She was a strong asset with the Canadian National Team as a right side, left side, and setter during her 71 international matches. Her strongest attributes were her blocking ability and her attacking efficiency as she became one of the National teams best attackers. As part of Team Canada at the 2010 World Championship Qualifier, she was named tournament MVP and best spiker.

Dodds-Little played with the University of Alberta Pandas and in her three year CIS career she was CIS MVP and an All-Canadian, as well as earning MVP honours as the Pandas won the National Championship in 2007.
