A. Elementary Stream

The Elementary Volleyball Program is a resource for elementary school teachers working with children ages 6 to 11 years. (gr. 1-6)

What is the Elementary Program?

It is a National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) online course that is:

- designed for Elementary school teachers delivering a physical education curriculum.
- a useful resource for noon hour and after school programs.

Overview:

The Elementary Volleyball Program:

- introduces children to the game of volleyball in a fun and interesting way,
- uses a variety of participant formats (1 v 1; 2 v 2; and 3 v 3) for the activities/games,
- uses play experience to help children learn basic game tactics, technical skills, and rules,
- includes a 150-page Teacher Guide with sample lesson plans and assessments.

Key Components:

- uses lighter and softer volleyballs.
- activities/games are played on a smaller court (badminton court), or a volleyball court divided in half, lengthwise.

B. Community Stream

SMASHBALL - FUNdamentals

(Designed for children: gr. 1 - 3; ages 6 - 8 years)

It is a volleyball program which:

- introduces children to the game of volleyball in a fun and interesting way;
- uses play experience (games & activities) to help children learn and develop basic movement and motor skills, game tactics, and rules;
- uses lighter and softer volleyballs;
- is played on a smaller court (badminton court or modified volleyball court)
- uses a variety of participant formats (1 v 1; 2 v 2; and 3 v 3) for the activities/games

SMASHBALL – FUNdamentals is often organized as an 8 sessions program (usually - 1 hr/session)

SMASHBALL - Learn to Train

(Designed for children: gr. 4 - 6; ages 9 - 11 years)

It is a volleyball program in which:

- children learn the basic skills of volleyball; (spiking, fore-arm passing, overhead passing, and serving)
- children practice the skills through modified game play (SMASHBALL) that incorporates:
- the use of lighter and softer volleyballs,
- a badminton court with the net at badminton height or, a modified volleyball court with a lowered net and;
- a maximum of 4 players per side

SMASHBALL – Learn to Train is often organized as an 8 sessions program $(1 - 1 \frac{1}{2} hrs/session)$

SMASHBALL - FUNdamentals - sample training program - Refer our website links

What is SMASHBALL?

It is:

- a volleyball game-play variation that emphasizes attacking (hitting/spiking).
- fun and fast-paced.
- ideally suited for use as the game play component for Grassroots programs
- a game that can be used as a 'stand-alone' game for intramurals, noon-hour and/or
- after school programs.

How is SMASHBALL played?

• from an ATTACK - the receiving team can catch the ball directly OR, catch the ball after it bounces once; and continue the rally.

NOTE: Introductory progressions use a CATCH & TOSS method for ball movement (*passing*) between players. As the players' skills improve, they are encouraged to progress (*transition*) to the use of volleyball skills for all contacts (*passes*) during game play.

Tournament Sanctions are \$50+GST and non-refundable, although they can be transferred to a different date in the same club season. Tournament Sanctions will be accepted starting September 15, 2023.

No tournaments will be sanctioned December 1-3 for ages 16-18U.

Tournament requests for a Provincial Weekend will be subject to referee availability and will not be approved until the Provincial Referee availability has been confirmed. Tournaments in the same location and on the same date as a Sask Cup or Provincial Championship will need to pay Referees the Sask Cup rate not the club rate, if referee availability allows.

Section 5: Age Class Programs

In cooperation with Volleyball Canada, Sask Volleyball offers Volleyball Athlete Development Programs for young women and men in nine different age categories.

Every team that registers is eligible to compete at the Provincial Championships provided they have played in the minimum number of tournaments for that age-class. All teams that play in a Provincial Championship are eligible to compete at a National Championship for the same age-class.

Overage Athletes

For 18U only, athletes born between January 1 – August 31, 2005, and are in Grade 12 for the 2023-2024 academic year, (first year grade 12) are eligible to compete as an Overage Athlete.

For the 2024 Season, as per the Volleyball Canada rule, athletes born January 1, 2005 – August 31, 2005 can play on an 18U team. These athletes are not allowed to be a part of a post-secondary program – they can-not be playing or training with a post-secondary team. Each team can have 2 of these 'overaged' athletes on their team.

No Age Exemptions will be granted for Female Age Classes in 2024 other than for 18U listed above.

*New rule as of 2017 - Athletes that are born Sept 1, 2005 — December 31, 2005, and who have already graduated high school are eligible to play on an 18U team and are not considered overaged.

Start Date

Club approval will open Friday, September 1, 2023. All clubs must complete at the club approval at https://app.teamlinkt.com/register/find/saskvolleyball

Sanctioned team tryouts may be held Sunday, September 3 – Sunday, October 8, 2023, on **SUNDAYS ONLY.** Starting Friday, October 13, tryouts can occur any day, for all age groups. Team Registration will open Wednesday, November 1, 2023.

All sanctioned team practices may start on Monday, November 27, 2023, and after your team has registered with Sask Volleyball for the 2023-2024 Season.

Team Registration for Sask Cup #1 will open Thursday, November 23, 2023, and will close with a deadline of Thursday, December 14, 2023. Early Bird Registration will close Thursday, December 7, 2023.

Practices/tryouts not sanctioned have no insurance through Sask Volleyball.

Sask Volleyball will support SHSAA and only offer sanctioning to events that run September – November 26th that don't house high school athletes on their rosters.

Eligibility

Coaches are responsible for ensuring that teams comply with Sask Volleyball and VC eligibility criteria for the registration of teams. **Athletes can only play for and be registered with 1 club.** Proof of age will be required at Provincials. One of Birth Certificate, Driver's License, Passport, SGI ID card, or Health Card will need to be shown as identification. Coaches are asked to please have ALL PROOFS photocopied on a single sheet of paper which can easily be checked at registration check in prior to their first match. The sheet will be returned to the coach, Sask Volleyball will not retain any identification documentation.

Summary of Fees

The \$50+GST Event Sanctioning fee must be paid for all tryouts prior to team registration. Registration fees of \$93 per individual (athletes, coaches, and anyone else on the bench) MUST be paid prior to a team's first practice to qualify for insurance. Should a team fail to abide by Sask Volleyball event policies and procedures during the year, a \$100 Team Performance charge will be issued and collected before the team will be permitted to continue participation. Individual registration fees and Event Sanction Fees are non-refundable and non-transferable.

Team Registration Procedure

Registration must be done on-line. Team registration for the 2023-2024 Age-Class Indoor Season will be available beginning Wednesday, November 1, 2023. All try-outs and training must be sanctioned by Sask Volleyball to ensure that insurance requirements are met. Forming a Team

Groups of 8 to 15 athletes and up to 4 coaching staff may register as a team in the appropriate age category. Coaches may only be listed as head coach on 1 team in each age category. Please note the playing requirements for each individual age group. Teams may have up to 15 players listed on the roster but only 12 players can be listed on the scoresheet for each match (VC rule 4.1.1). All 15 players can be dressed in uniform and participate in warmups. (A minimum of 8 athletes/team are required for registration, but only a minimum of 6 athletes are required for an event).

If you are head coaching more than 1 team in multiple age groups, and the teams compete on the same weekend, you may only head coach 1 team that weekend.

Athlete Recruitment/Transfer Policy

All players are **free agents** at the end of the indoor playing season, May 31, and will remain as such until they are registered with Sask Volleyball for the next, (2023-2024), Indoor Season. Once a player has committed to a team **and** completed the registration process with Sask Volleyball for the upcoming season, they are no longer free agents. At this point:

- Club personnel are not to continue recruitment of registered athletes that are from outside of their own club.
- Club personnel are not to instruct or encourage others to recruit registered athletes from outside of their own club. This includes using their own athletes for recruiting purposes.
- Teams wanting to include players from outside their own club to compete in elite tournaments, (ie. Best of the West), must initiate contact with such athletes through the athletes' current head coach only. Only after the current head coach has given permission can further communication with the athlete or athlete's family move forward.
- Players can only practice with teams in their own club. To participate in a practice with a team from outside their club, athletes need prior permission from their current head coach.

Clubs, teams or personnel violating recruiting guidelines are subject to sanctions levied by Sask VB

Registered athletes **may not transfer** to a different club without the consent of Sask Volleyball. When transfer consent is given, a transfer date will be stated as to when it will be effective, at a minimum of fourteen days after application. *To transfer, a player must meet the following requirements:*

- Provide a written request to Sask Volleyball stating the reasons for the transfer.
- Obtain a written release from the club or team the player wishes to leave. A release may not be held unreasonably. If a club or team refuses to provide a written release, Sask Volleyball will determine whether the transfer is allowed.
- Submit a new registration form.
- No transfers will be allowed after the Roster Freeze deadline of Feb 20.

Rules

Rules for the 2023-2024 Age Class Season comply with current 2023-2024 Official Volleyball Canada Rules, unless otherwise stated with respect to each age category. Rulebooks can be purchased from Sask Volleyball office.

Sask Volleyball Changes for 2023-2024

• Sask Cup 1 format:

teams will now start the tournament in either Division 1 or Division 2 based on their seeding, the same format as Sask Cup 2 and Sask Cup 3.

[*EXCEPT 13UW & 14UM – SEE WOMEN 13U TOURNAMENT FORMAT p.19; 14UM TOURNAMENT FORMAT p. 28]

- Fair Play rule for 15UW will again be in place for Sask Cup 1 and Sask Cup 2:
 - o Coaches must start all players within a match. Volleyball Canada 'Fair Play' rules apply.
 - o All players listed on the score sheet must start the first or second set.
 - Substitutions are not permitted in the first or second set.
 - NOTE: In the case of injury, an Exceptional Substitution may be made. The
 injured/ill player may not return to the same set but may return to play in
 subsequent sets in that match.
 - Any lineup can be used at the start of the third set. Teams are strongly encouraged to distribute playing time among all players on the team.
 - Teams switch sides in the third set once a team reaches 8 points.
- For 15UW Sask Cup 3 and Provincials there will be modifications to fair play rule:
 - Set 1: subs allowed after either team has scored 15 points. After 15 points coaches can substitute (12-sub limited).
 - Set 2: any athlete that did NOT start set 1 must start set 2. After 15 points coaches can substitute (12-sub limited).
 - o Set 3 (if necessary): No restrictions, 12-sub limited rule applies.
 - * Please note this is not a Volleyball Canada rule and will NOT be used at Nationals.
 - ** If there is a 15U Men's category for Provincials they will NOT use the Fair Play rule, but will follow all Volleyball Canada 15U Men rules re: Volleyball Canada rule book.

- Volleyball Canada Warmup Protocol will be used at all Sask Volleyball Sanctioned events see Volleyball Canada Rule Book for Protocol outline.
- Sask Volleyball will be using the Volleyball Canada Concussion Policy and Protocol at Sask
 Cups and Provincial Championships

Tournament Registration Procedure

Registration for Sask Cups and Provincial Volleyball Championships will be done on-line through TeamLinkt. Teams will only be allowed to register for Sask Cups after they have completed the membership registration (including payment) and their coaches have been approved by Sask Volleyball (must upload their RIS and current CRC to their TeamLinkt registration). Sask Cup registration fees are only refundable until the entry deadline. If a refund is requested prior to the registration deadline a refund will be issued minus a \$50 admin fee. After the registration deadline has passed, no refund will be issued.

- in Division 2: the top teams will be pooled together in a power pool.
- no movement between divisions.

14U Men

LTAD Stage: Training to Train

Principle Focus: To develop and consolidate sports skills.

Guidelines

Registered teams must play in a minimum of 2 tournaments, one being an out-of-town tournament, in the category they are registered, to be eligible for Provincials. It is recommended that teams compete in no more than 7 competitions including Provincials.

14U Men will utilize the 12 limited substitution rule with NO libero.

The Mikasa VQ200W-CAN will be the official competition ball for this age category.

Coaches must start all players within a match. Volleyball Canada 'Fair Play' rules apply.

- i. All players listed on the score sheet must start the first or second set.
- ii. Substitutions are not permitted in the first or second set. In the case of injury, as Exceptional Substitution may be made. The injured/ill player may not return to the same set but may return to play in subsequent sets.
- iii. Any lineup can be used at the start of the third set. Teams are strongly encouraged to distribute playing time among all players on the team.
- iv. Teams switch sides in the third set once a team reaches 8 points.

Sask Cup Structure

Sask Cups will be used for the 2023-2024 Age Class season.

Sask Cup #1 - Tripleball will be used as the game play format at Sask Cup #1.

Any tournaments that are sanctioned and occur prior to Sask Cup #1 are expected to run as Tripleball tournaments.

An explanation of <u>Tripleball</u>, including an instructional video, can found on the Sask Volleyball website.

Sask Cup #2 and Provincial Championships, traditional Volleyball Canada Format will be used.

LTAD Stage: Learn to Compete

Principle Focus: Optimize fitness preparation and position specific skills.

Guidelines

- Registered teams must play in a minimum of 2 tournaments, one being an out-of-town tournament, in the category they are registered, to be eligible for Provincials. It is recommended that teams compete in no more than 7 competitions including Provincials.
- The Mikasa V200W-CEV will be the official competition ball for this age category.
- 18U Men will utilize the 6 limited substitution rule with libero.

Sask Cup Format

- A serpentine seeding system will be utilized to place teams into pools in the preliminary round
- Sask Volleyball reserves the right to adjust the seeding to avoid teams from the same club playing in the same pool in the preliminary draw.
- Draws are intended to provide each team with 6-8 matches each.
- Each tournament will have teams start in either Division 1 or 2. There will be a set of crossover matches to allow teams from Division 2 an opportunity to compete in Division 1.

NOTE: 18U Men will have an additional Sask Cup tournament in 2024: Sask Cup 3.

Coach & Person in Authority (PIA) PROVINCIAL Requirements

All athletes have the right to a NCCP Certified coach.

All coaches have the responsibility to:

Have the required training to provide an environment that is physically, mentally, emotionally and socially safe for all athletes and participants.

Have the required training to be able to provide a responsible learning environment that incorporates VC's teaching methodologies, technical guidelines and long-term athlete development principles.

Ensure that all training is current and updated as required, to be able to provide a safe and responsible sport experience for all.

ALL COACHES & PIA who are on the practice court with athletes or on the bench during sanctioned Sask Volleyball or Volleyball Canada events, must have a;

1. NCCP#,

- 2. Criminal Records Check (CRC),
- 3. Respect in Sport (RIS),
- 4. Screening Disclosure Form,

completed at the time of team registration. Team registrations will not be approved until these 4 elements have been verified by Sask Volleyball. All documents are to be uploaded to your profile in the registration system.

ALL COACHES must adhere to the **Responsible Coaching Movement's Rule of Two** which states that any one-on-one interaction between a PIA and an individual athlete must take place within earshot and view of a second PIA. If possible one of the PIAs should be the same gender as the athlete. If a PIA is not available, another screened volunteer, parent or adult can be recruited. An exception is made for medical emergencies.

ALL HEAD COACHES must meet the following National requirements below before March 31, 2024. If a Head Coach must be replaced at Sask Volleyball/National Championships, the replacement coach must have a minimum of MED Online Evaluation and Making Headway.

Fines will be held in trust for one calendar year for the fined coach or club to access for the registration cost of missing certification components. Exemptions will only be considered if rationale is received in written form, prior to **February 20, 2024**. All requests are to be sent to michelle@saskvolleyball.ca.

Coach & Person in Authority (PIA) NATIONAL Requirements

MANDATORY ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR HEAD COACHES:

Head Coaches listed on any VC National Championship roster must complete the requirements in Section A (below) to be eligible to participate. These requirements are mandatory for all **Head Coaches** regardless of certification status. PTA's will verify requirements for all Head Coaches through their registration system.

DEADLINE: Pending Provincial membership approval and National registration deadlines.

SANCTIONS: Head Coaches who are missing any, or all, of the requirements in Section A (below) will be ineligible to participate with their team in a **Head Coach** capacity at a VC National Championship for that year and will not be listed on the final team roster.

In addition to the Head Coach, a **Person in Authority** includes, but is not limited to, all **assistant coaches**, **team trainers** and **team managers** who are listed on the Nationals roster. These requirements are mandatory for all Persons in Authority regardless of certification status.

DEADLINE: Pending Provincial membership approval and National registration deadlines.

SANCTIONS: Any Persons in Authority who are missing any or all the requirements in Section B (below) will be ineligible to participate with their team as a **Persons in Authority** at a Nationals for that year and will not be listed on the final team roster.

MINIMUM CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR HEAD COACHES:

SANCTIONS: Head Coaches who do not meet the requirements for that year (outlined below) will be subject to a \$250 CAD fine, payable prior to participation in that year's Nationals.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Head Coaches who have achieved *Certified* status in their appropriate context are still required to complete the mandatory requirements and maintain *Active* status in the NCCP Locker. *Coaches with an 'Inactive' status are not eligible*. Please refer to *Volleyball Canada's NCCP Certification Maintenance Guide* on how to remain *Active*.

A coach that has moved from 14U-16U into 17U-18U age group must have the appropriate requirements for the 17U-18U category. A coach who has the requirements for 17U-18U, is eligible for 14U-16U, however is encouraged to obtain education for the appropriate context.

An exemption application to the Certification Requirements after the March 30, 2024 deadline, will **only be considered** under the following conditions:

- 1. 1st year Head Coach at the 14U or 15U category. This will be verified through the Locker based on mandatory requirements dates of completion, i.e. Initial Locker Activity Fall 2023-Winter 2024.
- 2. A head coach is assigned to a team roster, after March 30, 2024 based on approved roster changes by VC.
- 3. A PTA is unable to offer a workshop or provide an evaluator due to unforeseen circumstances prior to the deadline.
- 4. There is confirmation through The Locker of professional development taken within the previous 3 months (Jan-March 2024) not including the mandatory requirements.

A request for an exemption will be available after March 30, 2024 through a Formstack link. Any exemptions provided by the PTA are not applicable to the VC Nationals exemption process. An exemption application does NOT guarantee an exemption will be provided.

**Development and Advanced Development Certified Coaches need to complete 20 PD points every 5year cycle. If your status states 'Not Renewed' in The Locker, you are not meeting requirements and need to complete the remaining PD points to regain certified status.

2023-24 Referee Pay Rate Schedule

All assigning of referees for club or exhibition matches must be requested and coordinated through the RRC or a Referee Committee Member in your zone. This will ensure the 10% referee development fee is submitted to Sask Volleyball and all referees are registered and have completed any mandatory requirements. **Mandatory requirements are: Safe Sport module completion and Police Record Check (within last 36 months) Failure to comply with this process will have repercussions of no other club tournaments being sanctioned or potentially the inability to attend provincial championships.

*Effective for the 2023-2024 season, pay rates for Sask Volleyball-run tournaments include a per diem fee. There will be a meal per diem rate for club tournaments of \$4/match if the club tournament does NOT provide meals for the referees free of charge. IF the club tournament does provide meals, there is no additional fee to the referee match rate.

**There is a 10% deduction on the match rates for referees that goes to the Referee Development Fund. This applies to all Sask Volleyball and club tournaments. **Failure to remit the deduction will result in no further club tournaments being sanctioned for that club or potentially the inability to attend provincial championships.

WARM-UP PROTOCOL

Volleyball Canada has introduced a warm-up protocol that prohibits anyone from taking up a position inside the receiving court during the hitting portion of the warm-up.

The protocol is now <u>required</u> and must be followed by all teams during the hitting portion of the team warm-up, (article 7.2.4 of the Indoor Rulebook).

a) Athletes must remain on their side of the net immediately following an attack and only move to the opposite side of the net from outside of the court. Athletes are not permitted into the receiving court.

Any ball from the receiving side of the court, entered to the attacking side, must be entered from outside of the court.

Retrieved balls must be returned along the sidelines of the court and not through the receiving court. If the team is using both sides of the court, i.e., full court game type activity – only one ball can be in play at any given time.

Opposing teams are not permitted to use volleyballs in the free zone during the other team's allocated court time. It is recommended for the opposing team to support the retrieval of volleyballs for the team on the court.

Teams not adhering to the protocol will be notified by the referee that they are to follow the above stated regulation. Teams must then adjust their warm-up accordingly. Time allotted for the hitting warm-up will not stop during the notification and adjustment period.

If a team chooses NOT to adjust their warm-up accordingly after the direction of the referee:

- 1) a Sask Volleyball representative may then be involved. The team in violation of article 7.2.4 will forfeit the rest of their warm-up AND either a side-out will be applied to the offending team if they have first serve or a point will be awarded to the opposition if they have first serve.
- 2) the referee will note on the scoresheet the team who chooses not to follow the warm-up protocol,
- 3) In the event of repeated offenses, Sask Volleyball will administer appropriate disciplinary action as per Sask Volleyball's Code of Conduct Policy.
