TOURNAMENT NOTES

A. Seeding

- No seeding needed

B. Rules/Format

- All 2024-2025 Volleyball Canada Rules will be in effect.
- The **Mikasa V200W-CEV** will be the official competition ball for this age category.

C. Officiating

Your team will provide Minor Officials for each game in which you are scheduled to play. Your team must provide **1 Scorekeeper** and **1 Linesperson** per match. If players assume either of these roles, they are still eligible to play and may be substituted in to play. Alternatively, your team may wish to have volunteers take care of these duties.

(**NOTE:** Hats are not to be worn by Coaches, athletes, or minor officials {lines persons during a match.})

D. Tie Breaking Criteria

Based on Volleyball Canada Rules, if two or more teams are tied at the end of round robin play, the following criteria will be applied in order:

- a) The team having the best ratio of **won/lost matches**, considering matches **between tied teams**, will be ranked higher;
- b) The team having the best ratio of **won/lost games**, considering matches played **between the tied teams**, will be ranked higher;
- c) The team having the best ratio of **won/lost games**, considering **all matches of the round**, will be ranked higher;



- d) The team having the best ratio of **points for/against**, considering games played **between tied teams**, will be ranked higher;
- e) The team having the best ratio of **points for/against**, considering **all games played during the round**, will be ranked higher;
- f) As determined by the Organizing Committee (e.g. extra game, toss of coin, etc.)

E. Medical Room

- There will be a medical room with an athletic trainer on-site, for athletes requiring first-aid. If athletes anticipate requiring attention, they are encouraged to bring their own supplies (i. e., tape).
- There will be a **\$5 charge per roll** of tape if an athlete does not have her own tape.

F. Match Preparation

- Please have your team ready to play on time, even if your court is behind schedule. We may move your game to another court.
- Teams are expected to have most of their warm-up completed before taking the court, (i.e. jogging, stretching, Thera band work etc.).
- Official warm-up will begin immediately after the referee calls for captains.
- There will be **3 minutes** set aside for official on-court ball control warm-up before hitting/serving warm-up starts. The 3 minutes will start at the direction of the referee.
- Each team will have **5 minutes of hitting/serving** warm-up to **start** the tournament. Once each team has completed a match, they will be given **3 minutes of ball control** and a **minimum of 3 minutes hitting/serving** warm-up.
- Your co-operation would be appreciated in moving our tournament ahead of schedule if the opportunity presents itself.

All games shall start on time as scheduled. Failure of a team to be ready to play at the scheduled time will be penalized by the loss of the first set by forfeit. A further 15 minutes will be allowed before the forfeiture of the second set.

- Teams must supply their own warm up balls.
- Coaches, please fill in your rosters and sign the score sheet prior to each match.

G. Warm-up Protocol

Volleyball Canada has developed a "Warmup Protocol" that all teams are now expected to follow, (re: **Rule 7.2.4**).

Teams not following the protocol will have that notation recorded on the game scoresheet by referee and:

- will be informed by the referee to change their warmup routine immediately.
- teams still not following protocol will be assessed either a side out or a point will be awarded to opposing team.
- teams who repeatedly do not attempt to follow the warmup protocol may be subject to further sanctions after review by tournament coordinating committee and Sask Volleyball.

H. Proof of Age & Check-In

NOTE: Team Check-In will take place at the ITC (International Trade Centre), on **FRIDAY, APRIL 11** from 6 – 8 p.m. If your team is from out of town, please let me know and we can make arrangements for check in.

Check-in will take place at **Guest Services**.

THERE WILL BE NO CHECK-IN PROVIDED ON SATURDAY, APRIL 12.

- Coaches must show one **government issued document** for EACH athlete (original, photocopied or screenshot of health card, birth certificate or passport accepted).
 - **Suggestions to speed up the check-in process:**
 - *Copy the documents of many athletes (4, 5, 6 or more) onto a single sheet of paper.*
 - *Arrange the documents in order of player jersey numbers.*
 - **NOTE:** If documentation is not produced, athletes will **NOT** be allowed to play.
- At check-in, coaches will receive their Coach's package.

The coach's package includes: - the team's Official roster (*this is presented at the start of EACH match*) and,
- Authorization wristbands.
- All Head and Assistant Coaches **MUST** wear their wristband before they will be permitted (Authorized) to be on the bench.

I. Photos

- TeamWorks Photo will be taking a Team Photo of every team at the event for the Sask Volleyball archives. You will receive an email early in the week prior to the tournament, indicating a timeslot that has been reserved for your team. The assigned time will be either immediately before or after one of your matches early in the tournament. If that scheduled time doesn't work for you, you can drop by the TeamWorks Photo booth in the lobby and they will reschedule your team photo.

J. Photography

NOBODY is allowed onto the court areas to take photos of athletes **before, during or after** matches. This includes professional photographers that may have been hired by teams.

K. Team Videotaping:

Sask Volleyball asks that all teams wishing to set up video equipment, comply with the following:

- *teams are allowed to set up **video equipment, at floor level**, on the opposite side of the courts from the teams.*

L. Awards

Medals will be awarded to the team that finishes 1st.

M. Results
